 16 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

 18           Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Combating  
 19 Corporate Espionage in Florida Act."

117 this section to pay restitution, which shall include the value  
118 of the benefit derived from the offense, including any expenses  
119 for research and design and other costs of reproducing the trade  
120 secret that the person has avoided by committing the offense.

121 (6) In a prosecution for a violation of this section, the  
122 fact that the person so charged returned or intended to return  
123 the unlawfully obtained or used trade secret ~~article so stolen,~~

125 (7) A person who owns a trade secret that is unlawfully
